CANADA SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY MUSEUM -- CLIMATE CHANGE ADAPTATIONS (VIRTUAL)

This program encourages students to think about climate change adaptation and mitigation through a variety of activities. Students will develop a better understanding of the factors that contribute to climate change, and the effects of climate change on society, the economy, and the environment. They will also take on the role of exhibition designer; they will consider the choices involved in creating a museum exhibition related to climate change, and will be challenged to create content to inspire its audience and provoke thoughtful reflection. THE CANADIAN MUSEUM OF NATURE -- EXPLORING ROCKS AND MINERALS WORKSHOP (VIRTUAL)

The stories of the Earth are written in the rocks! This online workshop is an introduction to geology in which a museum educator will guide students through observations, comparisons, and sorting of real rocks and minerals. Like geologists, they too will learn to "read" the stories of rock formation and change. Highly interactive, the presentation includes demonstrations, close-ups, gallery highlights, and some behind-the-scenes glimpses of the museum. Topics covered include the rock cycle, types of rocks, mineral formation, mineral uses, and the properties of and changes in matter. (30 students maximum)
